CHAPTER SIX

Mystery of The Holy Days

After the incident at the Feast of Tabernacles in Jerusalem, young Yeshua realized—in his zeal to enter prematurely into the plan—his parents had experienced some worry and pain. Riding along with his parents, on their way home, he considered the recent events. He would be more thoughtful. He cunningly deceived his kingdom of angels into following him in the great revolt against the heavenly powers of Elohim."

Tears filled Yeshua's saddened eyes, spilling onto his grave face as he remembered the tragic occurrence. "What destruction and havoc filled the universe! The heavens heaved and vomited; gas and brimstone spewed forth. Suns exploded, shooting forth belching flames into the universe; planets of beauty turned to charred, ash covered cinders. The turbulent heavens, once filled with brilliant, clear light, became blanketed with total blackness and deadly gasses. I watched in horror as Lucifer was cast down in wrathful rage and defeat. Like the blinding glow and deafening crack of lightening he fell back to the earth to replan his vengeful strategy. Once, we had harmony and joy; I gloried in his perfection. Now, he has become my constant enemy. Having never given up, he still seeks ways to destroy me, to unlawfully wrest away my power and forcefully take over the universe. He thinks to deceive me and destroy the wonderful plan of redemption for mankind by enticing me to follow his wicked rebellious ways. He refused to acknowledge that our plan became immutable the day the Ancient of Days and I Am agreed to fulfill it.

"With the destruction of the former perfect Earth, the first phase of the plan gave way to the second. I, as I Am, reshaped the earth and cleansed the thick darkness from the heavens. Exposing the earth once again to light and freshness was the beginning of the next step in the plan. The Great One directed as I divided the light from the darkness. I began the count of one full day to begin at evening and end the following evening. They are to eat, each day, of the unleavened bread, which represents their partaking of my sacrifice and my life. Number seven is a number I chose to signify completeness. The first and last day of the seven days are holy Sabbaths picturing the beginning and ending of a complete, life-long struggle against the natural pulls of carnal, human nature. I gave my chosen family a total of seven annual holy days picturing my complete plan for mankind.

"The third holy day, 'Pentecost', pictures the out-pouring of the holy spirit. It will be available to all who answer The Father's call to repentance, believe my words, and accept my sacrifice. I will deliver them from their bondage of sin. And the process of putting sin out for the remainder of one's life begins. Then, the gift of the Holy Spirit is given freely.

"The fourth holy day, 'Feast of Trumpets', represents a a time of struggle, a call to war against the evil forces of the spirit world. This is a trumpet warning, a time of repentance for my church. During the seven trumpets there will be much suffering. Steadfastness, faith, and patience will be the weapons, until the end of this present age.

"Indeed, at the end of this third age mankind will have few men left alive when I take over their destruction and cleanse the earth for a future age. My chosen ones will know my voice when I call them from their graves. Those who give their lives, for my name's sake, will meet me in the air. They will rule with me over the earth for the following thousand years.

"The fifth holy day, 'Day of Atonement', brings me joy and great anticipation. It represents Satan's imprisonment for a thousand years. For the first time, deceived mankind will be freed of his evil influence. The spiritual blindness, that Satan has inflicted upon the world, will be removed; they will experience a thousand years of peace without Satan to influence them to engage in war. Those who survive will begin a new age.

"Following the day of Atonement, the sixth annual holy Sabbath day, is the first day of the 'Feast of Tabernacles'. This exciting seven-day festival pictures the beginning of the new age for the whole earth. The glorious kingdom of Elohim shall be established on earth to rule over the nations for a thousand years. The age of the Gentiles will be a time of introducing my plan to them. The elect will teach them the way of peace and righteousness.

"Immediately after these days, the last of the seven annual holy Sabbaths is 'The Last Great Day'. This day pictures a wonderful part of the plan when the whole house of Israel will resurrect to physical life. I will unite them as one nation again, planting them in their own land. And David will once again be their king. I will make an everlasting covenant of peace with them. I will become their Yahweh and dwell among them, in my sanctuary, forever. I will give to them freely my holy spirit and restore to them the wealth they will lose, when I send them into exile for their sins.

Once again I will guide them and help them, and give them my blueprint showing them how to rebuild my temple and learn the lessons they refused to learn before. The resurrected sons of Zadok shall come near to me as ministering priests. The people's sacrifices will be accepted. They shall all know me from the least to the greatest. These are my memorials, my seven holy annual Sabbaths that I have given Israel to picture our immutable plan. But now my people are dull of hearing, and refuse to see, lest they will know the truth, and have no excuse for their rebellion. They rather choose to be deceived, to embrace their excuses.

"Though I entrusted them with my spiritual laws, they would do no more than keep them by the letter. They had no desire to live by them; their sins were ever before me. Therefore, I did not open their minds to see into the deeper spiritual meanings of my wonderful holy days, lest they understand with their mind and scorn them from their heart.

"Because of their weaknesses and their inability to keep my perfect spiritual laws of life, I instructed them in detailed physical ordinances. I gave them priests and sacrificial rituals to remind them of the seriousness of their sins. Their stubborn refusal to allow me to lead them resulted in wars, famines, diseases, and death. In my loving patience, when they cried out to me, I repeatedly rescued them. I fought their battles and gave them victory over their enemies. And when they listened to my judges I blessed them with prosperity.

"Instead of being an example in righteousness to the earth's nations, they repeatedly followed the examples of pagan nations. How they grieved us! They rejected my rule through my appointed judges and demanded rulers like their Gentile neighbor nations. They chose kings of flesh. So I gave them human kings: Saul, David, Solomon, and others.

"I would have made Saul a great ruler of my people had he not been presumptuous, stubborn and disobedient. I replaced him with David, a man who, though full of carnal mistakes, yet his desire was to please me. He admitted and humbly repented of his every sin, struggling to overcome his many weaknesses. Time after time, David proved his faithfulness to me. I knew I could not find another who would better qualify to rule with me over the whole House of Israel, in my future kingdom. I am so looking forward to resurrecting my beloved David to a glorious, powerful, spirit being. We shall then truly be brothers, working together, leading the physical tribes of Israel out of their bondage, back to their homeland. During David's and Solomon's reign I was able to pour out lavish blessings upon my chosen family as they struggled to live according to my laws of love and righteousness. I look back to that period of time as one of closeness and happiness...however, it was short-lived.

"Soon after the death of David's son, Solomon, the one great family of Israel split into two separate nations. New kings rose up over the ten-tribe House of Israel. They went to war against their sister, the House of Judah.

"In the following years many kings came into power over the two nations, some righteous, some evil. Many of their kings led them into idolatrous worship of images and make-believe gods. They accepted pagan religious doctrines and methods of worship contrary to my instruction, that I find abominable.

"I sent my servants and prophets, pleading with the families of Israel to turn again and choose life; they refused to listen. In time, because of their total rejection of our righteous laws of love and life, I allowed them to go into captivity under the hands of cruel Gentile rulers. I hoped they would repent of their sins and turn again to me...let me lead them back to full, rich lives. The House of Israel fell into the hands of Assyria, which drove them out of their land. If only they would have heeded. But, alas, in time, they adopted the ways of nations about them. The succeeding generations eventually lost knowledge of my laws and my Sabbaths. They, and the world about them, think of the House of Israel as descendants of foreign nations. How sad...for the next two thousand years the world shall look upon the great nations of the House of Israel as Gentiles. They shall become 'the lost tribes of Israel.'"

Yeshua shook his head in sorrow. His thoughts turned to the Jews. "Nor did Judah learn from her sister nation. Many years later, because of her sins, Judah, also, went into captivity...slaves of the Babylonians. In the course of time, I stirred up a righteous and loyal man, Nehemiah, to lead parts of Judah, Benjamin, and Levi back to their homeland. As little children, they eagerly groped their way out of spiritual darkness. The Great One and I were exceedingly pleased with their efforts and their attitudes. What tremendous joy we shared watching the progress of their beginnings...the revival of the physical family I would be born into as a human being. I patiently guided them as they carefully rebuilt my house of worship. I continued to reveal the laws of life to the tiny, struggling nation. What a wonderful experience, observing their spiritual awakening, as they rejoiced in their new-found understanding of my laws and my holy Sabbaths. This small remnant of the original twelve tribes, would become the only known nation from among the many great nations of Israel that would retain the name of their ancestral father, Israel.

"Through priests and prophets I instructed them in the forgotten laws that once governed Israel. I entrusted them with the responsibility of preserving the writings of my law. In these writings were prophesies of me, the future of great nations, of Israel and of all mankind. These writings spoke of me and of my mysteriously, profound mission during my brief visit as an earthling. They foretold my birth, my death, and my victory over death. They tell of my return to earth—in great power—as King of kings and Lord of lords, to establish the government of Elohim.

"The Great All Knowing One foresaw the future of both Judah and the whole House of Israel. Even while the House of Israel was in captivity, he saw the lost tribes growing into great and powerful nations. They would fulfill the promise made to Abraham, fulfilling the prediction concerning Joseph, voiced by my dying servant, Israel. He saw the descendants of Joseph's sons, Ephraim and Manasseh, becoming a great, powerful commonwealth of nations and one greater nation which would own the sea gates of their enemies. At the height of their power they would strongly influence and exercise control over many nations of the earth. He saw them turning further and further away from the laws of life. We had their future history recorded and preserved, to warn them of their fall and captivity. These prophesies predict their fate if they refuse to turn from their idolatrous sins.

Yeshua turned his thoughts back to his present Jewish nation. "If only the small nation of Judah had continued living according to the righteous instructions they first received. Had they followed the examples of their fathers, Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob; had they lived according to the laws of life, their

nation would have been a national leader over great nations of the world. They would now be enjoying abundant, lasting blessings. For a time they faithfully kept my laws; they grew and prospered. In time, new generations grew up who lost sight of the true meaning of my spiritual laws. Religious leaders—greedy for power and prestige—distorted my holy laws of love. They turned them into tools of rule and oppression, leading my people far from me."

His thoughts brought him back to the present. Again he must wrestle with the ever-constant, frightful awareness of his unique mission; it cloaked his mind with somber dread. "When I look back into the glorious past life I once shared with the Great Eloha my body trembles. I shudder with dread at the fearful agreement we mutually entered into—to leave my original glory. I agreed to reside in the earthly body The Great Eternal would prepare for me, and embark upon the most difficult mission ever attempted. When I look ahead into this physical life, there are severe trials, persecution, agony, and a terrifying, degrading death." His body shook; a dark cloud of heaviness threatened to overpower his thoughts.

He walked along a familiar trail into the hills. Secluded from the bustle of his neighborhood and family, he gave his whole being to seeking The Father's will. Gradually the heaviness lifted and he felt a new source of power flowing through his inner being.

"There is no room nor time for doubts and fears. I will not allow discouragement to enter, nor dwell upon my human frailties for the Great Father Eloha is ever near. By His power I will overcome the fear of pain and death. I will constantly force myself to look beyond human weakness. When I look into the future—beyond this body of flesh—I see the plan fulfilled and my spirit soars through the infinite expanse of eternity. I see a phenomenal, unequaled reproduction of the Elohim family, berthing the universe with loving, fruitful spirit beings. Of growth and unspeakable joys there will be no end." His lungs heaved a great gulp of fresh air in a sigh of renewed strength and firm resolve. "This is the glorious picture I shall plant deeply into my consciousness, reviewing it daily as I eagerly and forcefully battle against evil forces. I shall stand firm.
