

COPY, PASTE AND PRINT PARABLE

This study is showing something about parables using physical events, places, and things, to make a point into the spirit world. It may help you to understand more about the spiritual level of God and His plan, how He does what He does. Most of us know that Jesus used many parables in his teachings. When the disciples asked why he spoke in parables among the crowds, he answered:

Mr 4:11 And he said unto them, Unto you it is given to know the mystery of the kingdom of God: but unto them that are without, all these things are done in parables:

12 That seeing they may see, and not perceive; and hearing they may hear, and not understand; lest at any time they should be converted, and their sins should be forgiven them.

Why did he not want them to become converted? Read on.

The disciples asked about the physical and he gave a spiritual answer. Jesus did the same thing In Mt.13:22 And, behold, a woman of Canaan came out of the same coasts, and cried unto him, saying, Have mercy on me, O Lord, thou Son of David; my daughter is grievously vexed with a devil.

23 But he answered her not a word. And his disciples came and besought him, saying, send her away; for she crieth after us.

24 But he answered and said, I am not sent but unto the lost sheep of the house of Israel.

This brings up the question of why Jesus responded with this remark? Jesus was thinking from a spiritual point of view when he answered. He had not been crucified yet, had not been reborn yet; he was still human, the age of grace had not been extended (as a whole) to Gentiles yet. That would not happen until after Jesus' resurrection and the sacrifice been offered. This was the last ditch offer to the "house of Israel" (family or nations, not Jews only) for repentance before their time of spiritual blindness. Someone is bound to ask, "Where do you find that in the Bible?" In Rom. Chapter 11. There will come a time when God will take away their sins and accept Israel again. No one gets a second chance but if the majority of Israel is spiritually blinded by God Himself, it will not be a second chance, but their first chance. This all takes place after "the whole house of Israel" is resurrected. Where do I find that in the Bible? In the last chapters of Ezekiel, starting in chp 37. This is all discussed in the web site www.foust.info in two studies, "Many are Called but Few are Chosen" and "Who are the First and the Last".

25 Then came she and worshipped him, saying, Lord, help me.

26 But he answered and said, It is not meet (suitable) to take the children's bread, and to cast it to dogs.

She, knowing he was referring to her as a Gentile, was not going to give up; she matched his parable with one of her own, and Jesus rewarded her faith by granting her request.

27 And she said, Truth, Lord: yet the dogs eat of the crumbs which fall from their masters' table.

28 Then Jesus answered and said unto her, O woman, great is thy faith: be it unto thee even as thou wilt. And her daughter was made whole from that very hour.

Now having said all this, we will go into our own parable of Copy, Paste and Print. Most computer users know that we can go into some sites of files and select a file we want, then select "copy." Then select

where you want to past the file and select “paste” and you have left the original untouched, but now it belongs to you, as well. The original has not been altered or changed in any way. When and if you decide to print it, you must start with a “clean” sheet of paper. If you try to print it on a pre-typed sheet of paper it will not work. So, now, after making this big bobo, if you still want the file you have to start all over again. You have to admit to yourself that you really messed up your clean sheet and determine to get a new sheet (attitude) and not do that again. If you continue doing it, there may come a time when you run out of clean sheets.

Now the modern parable of Copy, Paste and Print explains a number of spiritual revelations. The “copy” is the source of what you want for yourself. Of course you want to be like God to be in His kingdom, so we have to go to the source (His word) and begin to “copy” Him. This is how God can be everywhere at the same time, be in everyone at the same time, but does not change Himself. He just lets many copy, and then paste, but He stays the same. (Read the study, “Righteous Attitude”) on the web site. The next step of the parable is to Print it. If and when you decide to follow the footsteps of Jesus, you absolutely have to use a “Clean” sheet of paper. (Act 2:38) You must change your attitude, lifestyle, and more attitude! You are part of the many that are being “called”. Not only do you have to change your attitude but you have to get to know the author of the original script you copied from. The only way you can do this is to study, study, study, communicate with the author, and humbly obey the script you copied from

As you study the printed page, you will see that it is an instruction guide to eternal life, a spiritual life overflowing with more happiness and love than you can imagine in this physical state we exist in now.. Each time you hook your computer up to the power, think about this. Isn’t it wonderful? Where do I find that in the Bible? Rev.21 & 22. and throughout the writings of God’s prophets of the Bible.
